Home Care Packages

A Home Care Package is designed to help older Australians live independently in their own home for as long as possible and living the life they wish to lead.

- Nursing, allied health and therapy services
- Transport and personal assistance
- Management of skin integrity
- General household services

Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA)

Newcastle and Hunter Community Health is an approved DVA Community Nursing Provider.

Veterans' Home Care (VHC) is a DVA program designed to assist eligible DVA clients who need a small amount of practical help to continue living independently in their own home. Services include domestic assistance, personal care, respite care, and safety-related home and garden maintenance.

Our key role is to provide access to services to support those eligible to help avoid early admission to hospital or residential accommodation by providing access to Community Nursing Care.
